The staff and I look forward to sharing the night with you all.



### Principal's Report continued....

#### **Class Structures for 2014**

Teachers have begun to look at class structures for 2014. At this stage our numbers are as follows:-

K - 42Year 1 - 45 Year 2 - 53 Year 3 - 42

Year 4 - 45 Year 5 - 49 Year 6-43

Total enrolment is currently 319 students.

Possible class structures were discussed at the P&C meeting last Monday, particularly regarding forming straight classes where possible and stage classes when students couldn't all be placed into a straight class.

Currently we are considering the following class structures:-

2 x straight classes of Kindergarten students 2 x straight classes of Year 1 students

2 x straight classes of Year 2 students 3 x Stage 2 classes (Years 3 & 4 students together) 1x 4/5 class with Year 4 and Year 5 students together 3 x Stage 3 classes (Year 5 & 6 students together)

Staff will re-examine enrolment numbers and class structures for 2014 during Week 9 of this term. We are carefully considering the straight Year 1 and straight Year 2 classes and how these may be impacted by potential new enrolments. It may become necessary to form a Year 2/3 class to accommodate new local Year 2 enrolments, and if so then the Year 1 and Year 2 students will be converted to form four Stage 1 classes.

Staffing for 2014 is yet to be finalised, with the merit selection of a new classroom teacher currently underway. Ms Kelly will remain on maternity leave for all of 2014, while Mrs McGuire will continue her maternity leave for Terms 1 and 2. Both these positions will be temporarily filled whilst these teachers are on leave.

#### **Communication Survey Results**

The survey sent home last term was tabled at the last P&C meeting. A full copy of the survey will be found in the school's Annual School Report, to be updated to the school's website in early 2014.

The survey identified that the school is particularly poor in its communication of children's progress in literacy and numeracy.

When asked:-

'Parents are regularly informed of their child's progress in literacy and numeracy,' 17% said this was 'very like our school', 29% said this was 'quite like our school,' 37% said this was 'not like our school' and 9% said this was 'not at all like our school.'

These results indicate that nearly 50% of those surveyed do not believe the school regularly informs them of their child's progress in literacy and numeracy. What a terrible result. This is information we should be providing to parents; an understanding of their child's learning and how this sits alongside the expected standards within particular stages of learning. I decided it was important to investigate further, by meeting with a number of parents to ask if these results were surprising. They all said no. I recorded the responses each parent made throughout the conversation and I can confidently report that not one parent interviewed felt they understood where their child sat within the learning standard of that particular year group. Many offered suggestions of how we could improve this. These ideas will be taken to the staff for discussion, followed by recommendations of the P&C planning for Term 1, 2014. What is now clear is that we need to help parents understand how their child is doing at school, the progress they are making and the areas they need focus on, and how this can be communicated home so parents can better help students improve their identified weaknesses.

#### **Possible Ideas**

Teachers to provide parents with a mid term progress report.

Structured parent /teacher interviews outside the student lead conferences.

Communication sheets/checklists between home and school.

Teachers to focus on five students a week, sending home a more detailed checklist with short comments on progress to date and areas to focus on.

Students making folders of the learning that is sent home each term for parents to look at and make comment on.

I would like to thank those parents who responded to the survey or allowed me to question them a little more deeply, this helped me understand what was not occurring within the school and how to assist parents to know and understand how their children were progressing with literacy and numeracy (and all the other aspects of learning).

I gained some very valuable and worthwhile insights about communicating student learning to parents from teachers and ways in which we can improve on this in 2014.
