Turning Circle Safety

You may have noticed the mini traffic law enforcers up at the turning circle this week. 3/4S are working towards making the turning circle a safer place for everyone.

The children are teaching the following safety guidelines:

1. Please do not take a shortcut across the turning circle. The children watch and copy your example so walk on the safe path provided.

2. Stop between the drop off zone signs.

3. Move up to make space for everyone.

4. Children should exit on the left side where it's safe. If they must exit on the right, parents need to open the door and help them move safely to the path.

5. There's a 3 minute time limit when dropping off at the turning circle.

6. Please walk small children to the steps.

7. You are required to stay within 3m of your car.

The children were very excited to see anyone who didn't follow the rules. Problems included small children getting themselves out on the right side as cars passed, parents who stopped outside the drop off zone, mums and dads who stopped to have a chat and people who didn't move up. The children handled these problems by explaining why this shouldn't happen in a polite manner.

One Dad was very happy to see the rules being encouraged. "People are actually doing the right thing because the kids are here watching them. Drivers not moving up is a big problem here."

Our new record for dropping off is officially 3 seconds!

The majority of parents followed the rules and were rewarded with a big 'thumbs up' by our students.

Mrs Hackney, who supervised, was very impressed with the enthusiasm and maturity displayed by the 9 and 10 year olds. Their willingness to teach and help children and adults was a credit to them. The project is something that we will continue in 2016, especially when we have new parents and children that might need help learning the turning circle rules.

3/4T will be supervising next week.
