Student Progress Folders

Parents and caregivers should have received their children's Student Progress Folders at the end of last term. Thank you to the parents who completed the survey about the folders. The results have been collated and it is evident that the majority of parents indicated that the Student Progress Folders are a valuable record of student progress throughout the year and that they align well with the Student Progress Reports.

The survey results indicated that between 87% and 91% of parents felt that the student Learning Progress Folders assisted them with:

- understanding their children's learning
- effective communication of their children's progress
- evidence of their children's progress, and
- understanding the link between learning tasks and student progress reports

In regards to regularity of the receipt of Learning Progress Folders, 49% of parents indicated that the folders were sent home on a regular basis. This is one area that will be addressed in future planning for the school.
