#### **Learning Progress Folders**

Results of the parent survey regarding Learning Progress Folders were published in the last newsletter. Surveys were also given to the students for their thoughts on how they feel about the folders. Between 76% and 87% of students could understand their learning goals and see how they had progressed during the year. Approximately 79% of students enjoyed showing their learning tasks to their parents. The students felt that the majority of the work samples included writing, spelling and maths and they indicated that maybe more of the other Key Learning Areas could be included.

#### **Big Day In**

Students in Stage One have been studying persuasive texts as part of their English learning program this term. In order to consolidate their learning, 1C students have been writing letters trying to persuade me of the need for a whole school fun day at the end of the school year. As a result of 1C's very persuasive correspondence, the P&C were asked for their assistance with this proposal.
