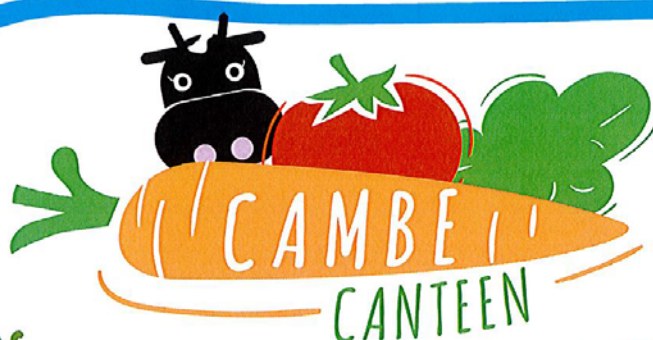
Canteen News

Stage 3 – Canberra Excursion

On Monday the 11th of September, Stage 3 embarked on an educational excursion to Canberra. We participated in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

A 6:15am start didn't stop the excitement and enthusiasm of the students as they boarded the bus for an extremely busy day.



The first part of the excursion taught us not only to reflect and honour those past and present serving defence members and families, it allowed us to embrace the importance and history of the War Memorial. Then it was straight to business at Parliament House where we were welcomed with a great surprise from our local MP Ann Sudmalis, before observing the House of Representatives and touring of the Senate.



The journey continued to the Royal Australian Mint, where we were shocked to see robots making the Australian coins! We learnt how the first coins came to Australia and how the coins have changed over time. The excitement was still high as we headed to Greenhills accommodation, where we called home for the few days. After familiarising ourselves with the camp, we enjoyed our first dinner.

With no time to waste, we headed to the Australian Institute of Sport. We firstly went into the interactive play room, where we got to play on lots of fun sporting activities. Then our group leaders showed us around to all the sporting arenas where the professional athletes train. That included the pool, stadium, gymnastics, gym and many more.



Then we went on tour through Embassy drive and stopped off at Mt Ainslie which had a very nice view, so everyone got their cameras out.

Next we set off to the museum of Australian democracy where we all had to wear white gloves so if we touched the art works they wouldn't get ruined. Then we went to the old House of Representatives. Two of the children got picked to roll play as madam speaker, which was very funny.



This day was wound up by going to the National Portrait Gallery and then some grouped indoor games back at Greenhills.



All good things must come to an end. Wednesday 13th September saw us visiting Questacon which was a favourite for everyone with lots of fun days to make and do. Plus going down a big free fall slide, which got everyone's adrenalin up. We were able to buy some goodies at Questacon gift shop and our final stop was the National Museum before departing for the trip home. Camp was an amazing experience where many memories were made.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of \$20.00 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion and was taking into account in final costs of the excursion.
